About the Library Needs Assessment

- In the fall of 2019, the Village engaged a consultant, Library IQ, to conduct a Library Needs Assessment to assess the community's need for library services

- There are four phases of the assessment:




About the ETC Library Survey


- The mailed survey was sent to a random sample of Pinehurst households in the summer of 2020 to help determine:
 - 1. What library services Pinehurst residents need, and
 - 2. How much Pinehurst residents are willing to pay to support library services.
- 410 residents completed the survey, resulting in a precision of at least +/ 4.8% at the 95% confidence level
- Disagreement ratings of >20% may indicate a need to address the dissatisfaction (approach used to evaluate annual Community Survey Results)


Demographics of Survey Respondents

Demographics of Survey Respondents

- 55% of respondents are Library users (consistent with our annual Community Survey results)
- 57% of Library users are frequent users (e.g. use the library weekly or once/twice a month)
- Only 14% of respondents have children in the household
- Age demographics of respondents favor residents 65 years or older




Q1: Do you Believe the Library Meets the Needs of Residents?










- Overall, 34% disagreement rating that the library meets resident needs (>20%), with much higher disagreement ratings from residents under 35 (54%)
- Users/Non-Users indicate similar agreement ratings










- 53% indicate children's books & magazines should be expanded (very or extremely needed)
- 49% indicate **adult books & magazines** should be expanded (very or extremely needed)
- 44% indicate young adult books & magazines should be expanded (very or extremely needed)
- Residents under 34 years old expressed a higher need for children's and young adult books & magazines










- 53% indicate **digital media** should be expanded (very or extremely needed); residents under 34 and ages 45-54 have the highest need for digital media
- 38% indicate **digital learning lab and public computers** should be expanded (very or extremely needed)
- 36% indicate print, copy, & scan services should be expanded (very or extremely needed)
- Residents under 34 years old expressed a greater need for all three of these digital services










 Greatest need for program expansion is children's programs: 50% or more of residents in <u>all</u> age groups indicated these should be expanded (very or extremely needed)










- 39% indicate a need for expanded book clubs, lectures, & discussion groups, with a <u>much greater need</u> expressed by residents under 34 (49%) and ages 45-54 (50%)
- 34% indicate a need for individual quiet study & work space, with a <u>much greater need</u> expressed by residents under 34 (50%) and ages 45-54 (52%)
- 31% indicate a need for conference & meeting space, with a greater need expressed by residents under 34 (43%)





- Only 15% of residents indicate a need for art, music, & performance space
- 37% indicate a need for **quiet relaxation space**, with a <u>much greater need</u> expressed by residents under 35 (51%)





Very limited need expressed for maker space or retail co-location




















Q5: Should VOP Fund & Operate the Village's Public Library?










Q6: How Much Would You Be Willing to Pay in Additional Taxes?

Summary of Key Findings

Summary of Key Findings – Library Needs

KEY Findings – Library Needs

Overall, 34% disagreement rating that the library meets resident needs (>20%), with much higher disagreement ratings from residents under 35 (54%)

KEY needs for expanded programs or capabilities expressed overall (Approx. 40% extremely or very needed):

- Book & magazine collection (adult, children's, & young adult
- Digital media
- Children's programs
- Digital learning lab & public computers
- Print, copy, & scan services
- Book clubs, lectures, & discussion groups
- Greatest need expressed is children's programs for residents under the age of 35 (69% say extremely or very needed)

KEY Findings – Library Needs

Additional KEY needs for expanded programs or capabilities expressed by younger residents (>40% extremely or very needed):

- Adult programs
- Young adult programs
- Conference & meeting space
- Individual quite study/work space
- Quiet relaxation space

More than 60% of Users/Non-Users and Households With/Without Children expressed a need for **extended** weekday and Saturday operating hours

Large amount of support for VOP to fund & operate the library

Summary of Key Findings – Library Funding

KEY Findings – Library Funding

Large amount of support for VOP to fund & operate a public library (67% overall), with greater support from Users (76%) and Households with Children (78%)

43% of residents do not support a tax increase to fund the library, but a greater % support a tax increase at some level (57% support at least a \$0.01 increase and 31% support up to a \$0.01 increase)

Residents that expressed a greater need for expanded library capabilities (Ages 45-54) are more willing to pay a tax increase

% of residents who would contribute to a library capital campaign:

- 21% Up to \$50
- 23% \$51 \$100
- 15% \$101 \$500
- 4% \$501 \$1,000
- 2% \$1,001 \$5,000
- 1% \$10,000+

Correlations of Findings With Prior Findings

Correlations of ETC Survey Findings with Prior Findings

- In February 2020, the Village obtained extensive public input on the Library Needs Assessment through four key means:
 - 1. Online Survey 386 respondents
 - 2. Public Input Meetings 115 residents attending
 - 3. Community Conversations four 1 ½ hour meetings with 53 residents
 - 4. Personal Interviews 26 personal interviews
- The ETC Survey and Online Survey results were similar in the following areas (Note: the Online Survey asked if respondents would be likely to use and the ETC Survey asked if there was a need for service expansion):
 - Greater than 30% disagreement ratings that the current library meets resident needs/has available space
 - KEY library needs expressed in both surveys: 1) Increased collection size; 2) Greater access to digital media; and 3) Expanded children's programs
 - > Households with children and younger residents expressed a greater need for library services than older residents
 - Consistent support for a digital learning lab
 - Not a lot of resident support or need for art, music, & performance space or maker space

Correlations of ETC Survey Findings with Prior Findings

- The following library needs were rated higher in the ETC Survey:
 - > Space for book clubs, lectures, & discussion groups
 - Individual quiet work/study space
 - Print, copy, & scan services
- The following library needs were rated lower in the ETC Survey:
 - Meeting/conference space
 - Retail co-location (coffee shop, etc.)
- Consistent themes from the ETC Survey and other public input methods:
 - > Need for a larger collection, more digital media, and expanded children's programs
 - Desire for extended library operating hours
 - Limited need for maker space
